Kent Mauntel, son of Lorraine H. (Bowman) and Kent Mauntel Johnson Sr. was born on December 28, 1954 in Alva, Oklahoma. He passed away suddenly at his home in Albany, New York on the 22nd of September

at the age of 54 years, 8 months and 25 days.

He attended the Alva Public School System and graduated with the class of 1973. He then attended and graduated from Oklahoma State University receiving his Business Degree.

Kent was married to Patty Griffin. Following their marriage they lived in Alva where he worked with his father and owned Kent W. Johnson & Sons.

He managed the Alva Golf & Country Club before moving to Albany, New York where he worked for Farm Family Insurance Company in Glenmont as an underwriter.

Kent was a member of the First Methodist Church, and an active member of the Rotary Club.

He was preceded in death by his sister, Karen Schmidt on June 29, 1995, his father on February 21, 2006 and an uncle, Norville Johnson on April 19, 1982.

Kent is survived by his mother Lorraine (Lorrie), a sister, Gwenell of Alva, two children, Michael and Aimee Griffin, and Tommy and Erica Griffin, three nieces, three nephews and their spouses, Pam and Rick Dilbeck, Curt and Tina Schmidt, Mark Schmidt, Jeremy and Amy Burroughs, Carly and Kevin Dodds, two cousins, Chris Johnson, David Johnson and his wife Louise and a very special friend, Elisa Dellavecchia, of West Hartford, CT., other relatives and friends.
