Dennis Eugene Meyer was born April 18, 1947 in Alva Oklahoma to Leola Faye (White) and Elmer Fredric Meyer. He passed from this life suddenly on August 31, 2020 in Wichita Kansas at the age of 73 years, 4 months and 13 days.
