Fred Hiram, son of Bertha Mae (Heaton) and F.M. Lieurance was born November 24, 1916 in Alva, Oklahoma. He passed away at the Beadles Nursing Home on the 11th of October at the age of 91 days, 10 months and 16 days.

He attended the Alva public school system and graduated with the class of 1933. He helped build the dam at the Great Salt Plains and did farm work. On February 1, 1944 he was married Lola Jane Heitt in Clovis, New Mexico. To their marriage two children, Michael Perry and Shirley Jean were born. Lola passed away on April 20, 1971 in Willard, Ohio.

Following their marriage they lived in Clovis, New Mexico where he also worked for the Railway Ice Company. In 1957 he was transferred to Willard, Ohio where he worked until he retired in 1981. In March of 2003 he came to Alva to make his home at the Beadles Nursing Home.

He was a member of the Baptist Church in Clovis, NM United Methodist Church in Willard, OH and the Alva Church of the Nazarene. Fred was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Clovis and a 32 Degree Scottish Rite Mason at the Sante Fe, New Mexico Consistory.

Mr. Lieurance was preceded in death by his great granddaughter, Cherity Newsome and his parents.

Fred is survived by his two children and their spouses, Shirley Jean and Andy Craig of Columbus, Ohio and Michael and Vonetta of Willard, Ohio. Nine grandchildren, Jamie Grimm, Michael Craig, Heather Craig, Timothy Reed,
