



Larry D. Marvin

August 22, 1927 - August 31, 2009

Lawrence Dean, son of Angelina (Smith) and Mark Penn Marvin was born in Minneapolis, Kansas on August 22, 1927. He passed away at the Oklahoma City Integris Baptist Medical Center on the 31st of August at the age of 82 years and 9 days.

He graduated from the Enid High School on May 25, 1945 and then attended Phillips University, Cameron Community College and Northwestern State College. He was a Laboratory and X-Ray Technician at the Alva General hospital for many years.

Larry was married to Viola Stermer on April 25, 1954 in Medford, Oklahoma. They made their home in Alva. He operated the laboratory for Dr. John Simon from 1952 to 1990. On June 23, 1992 he became the mail clerk at the Alva Central National Bank.

Mr. Marvin was preceded in death by his parents, a sister, Phyllis Kimery, and a brother, Raymond.

Larry is survived by his wife Viola, of the home. A brother and his wife, Leslie and Norma of Houston, Texas, a sister-in-law and her husband, Vermeillia and Ron Vaughan of Greenville, Texas. Several nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
