Leo Lonnie, son of Mae (Tomlin) and Lloyd Gilbert West was born May 31, 1928 at Fay, Oklahoma. He passed away at the Alva Share Medical Center on the 30th of April at the age of 82 years, 10 months and 29 days.

He attended the Garden Valley rural grade school near Fay, Oklahoma. When he was in the 5th grade they moved to Eagle City where he graduated with the class of 1945.

On February 17, 1951 he joined the United States Army serving during the Korean Conflict and was honorably discharged February 3, 1953.
