Marilyn Sue, daughter of Mae Marguerite (Swingle) and Glenn Adelbert Marcum was born in Alva, Oklahoma on July 2, 1942. She passed away at her home on the 9th day of March at the age of 66 years, 8 months and 5 days.

She attended the Alva School System and graduated with the class of 1960. She then attended OU where she received her Bachelors and Masters degree in Social Studies.

After graduating she moved to San Francisco working for the state as a Social Worker. Then returned to Oklahoma working at Vanita and the Enid State School after retiring she came back to Alva to live.

Miss Marcum was a member of the Alva First Baptist Church.
