Phyllis Nadine, daughter of Elva (Wesling) and Amon Davis was born in Wichita, Kansas on February 15, 1927. She passed away at the Alva Convalescent Home on the 7th of January at the age of 81 years, 10 months and 23 days.

She attended the Alva Public School System, Northwestern State College where she received her degree to teach high school English. Then went to the Bethany College at Lindsborg, Kansas and received her organ music training. Phyllis taught in Capron, Alva and Waynoka Schools.

Miss Davis was married to Earl Hein on April 29, 1951 at the Alva First United Methodist Church. To their marriage a daughter, Linda and a son, David were born. Earl passed away on April 8, 2003.

Following their marriage they lived in Alva and she taught school. They also farmed and ranched in the Capron and Burlington areas.

She was a member of the Alva First United Methodist Church where she played the organ for many years. She was a member of the Share Auxiliary and volunteered at the Share Convalescent Home, the N.E.A. the O.E.A. and the Retired Teachers Organization.

Mrs. Hein was preceded in death by her parents.

Phyllis is survived by a daughter, Linda Constantin, a son David and his wife Roberta Hein all of Alva. Three grandchildren and their spouses, Jules and Amanda Constantin of Alva, Kara and Lance Bienhoff of Shawnee and Karmen of Oklahoma City and one great grandchild, MaKenna Layne Bienhoff, other relatives and friends.
