Virgil, son of Henrietta (Lang) and Henry Sebastian Hofen was born on a farm southeast of Alva on December 19, 1915. He passed at his home in Dacoma on the 2nd day of August at the age of 93 years, 7 months and 14 days.

Virgil attended the Pleasant View Rural Grade School and helped his parents on the Farm.

He was married to Frances Grace Sweet on October 20 1935 at her parents home West of Dacoma. She passed away on March 7, 2005.

Following their marriage they made their home on a farm 5 miles west of Dacoma. They spent 69 years of their marriage living there where they farmed and raised cattle.

Mr. Hofen was a member of the Pleasant View Church, which merged with the Hopeton Wesleyan Church in 1968.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two sisters, Irma Wilt and Cleda Flint; a brother Everett, three nephews, Everett Hofen Jr., Donald Flint and Fredrick Flint.
